This means picking up the team bag from the school office, giving out and collecting in uniforms each week, organising the players and making sure that all members of the team are respectful and get a fair go on the field. Without parents to manage the teams we will not be able to enter the competition. The cost of Touch is \$12 per student. A part of the fee goes to the school for the use of the uniforms and allows us to replace uniforms as they wear out. Fees need to be paid before Friday 28th October or parents can contact the office to begin an automatic payment. Payment of fees must be sorted before children are allowed to play.
